About the exhibition

Everything is Connected, 22nd May – 3rd June 2025

In May 2025, the UCL Public Art and Cultural Engagement Team will deliver an exhibition celebrating the work of artists taking part in the public art programme for the <u>ION-DRI</u> a new landmark facility at 256 Grays Inn Road. The development will support UCL's existing facilities at Queen Square to create one of the leading translational neuroscience centres in the world.
